Carbon Footprint

By recycling, the employees of Sheetz have directly impacted the environment for the better.

In June, the employees of PEMMCO, Mfg. saved a total of **57.73 tons of waste** from entering the landfill. Of that total, **49 tons is steel waste, 5.07 tons is brass waste** along with **3.47 tons of aluminum waste**. The remaining overall total was rounded off with a small amount of **cardboard waste**.

Recycling 49 tons of steel waste saves **122,500 lbs. of iron ore, 68,600 lbs. of coal, and 5,880 lbs. of limestone**. Recycling 49 tons of steel waste also saves **196 cubic yards of landfill space** and approximately **176.4 barrels of oil**. Recycling 3.47 tons of aluminum waste saves **48,580 kilowatts of electricity** and **more than 137 barrels of oil**.

Some Waste & Recycling Facts You May Not Know About...

Fact 1: 350,000 aluminum cans are produced every minute while an aluminum can that is thrown away will still be a can 500 years from now!

Fact 2: Approximately 1 billion trees worth of paper are thrown away every year in the U.S.

Fact 3: The amount of wood and paper we throw away each year is enough to heat 50,000,000 homes for 20 years.

Fact 4: Americans throw away 25,000,000,000 styrofoam coffee cups every year.

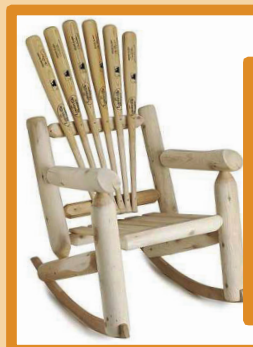
Fact 5: Mining and transporting raw materials for glass produces about 385 pounds of waste for every ton of glass that is made. If recycled glass is substituted for half of the raw materials, the waste is cut by more than 80%.

Fact 6: The United States population discards each year 16,000,000,000 diapers, 1,600,000,000 pens, 2,000,000,000 razor blades, 220,000,000 car tires, and enough aluminum to rebuild the US commercial air fleet four times over.
